Remembering Joyce

Joyce Smith loved animals her entire life. She was encouraged by parents who did not blink an eye at the addition of a bedraggled raccoon or orphaned squirrel to their household. This was a family who could not turn a blind eye to suffering or abuse, would cradle a baby bird against the wind or nurse a kitten back to health even if it meant not sleeping for days on end.

With such a background it was inevitable that Joyce would make animal rescue her calling and her passion. No matter where her life took her (and it was a tortuous path) the animals were always there rescuing her as she rescued them. Wherever she lived, there was bound to be some lost soul feeding off the hope that compassion brings.

With each broken wing or burnt tail which crossed Joyce's doorstep the dream of having a place where animals could be free from harm grew stronger and stronger. She knew that a

house in the suburbs was not the answer to the growing problem of cat overpopulation, wildlife injuries and general animal abuse. The animals needed a haven.

But havens are not easy to come by. However in 1996 Club Link generously offered to provide a property on the 7th Concession. Joyce took this chance to make her dream a reality; thus "Second Chance Wildlife Sanctuary" in Pickering was born. Animals of all kinds have lived on the property recovering from almost every form of neglect and abuse you care to imagine. Joyce has rescued and rehabilitated foxes, deer, skunks, raccoons, goats, ducks, rabbits, geese, pigs and, of course, cats. Her compassion is not limited by the boundaries of species.

Second Chance Wildlife Sanctuary is the legacy of Joyce Smith so to try to continue on without her is akin to a ship without a captain. We miss you, Joyce, and we know that you are watching over your sanctuary.

SANCTUARY

Since Joyce passed away in mid-August, some changes have taken place at the sanctuary. There are no longer any outside animals. One of the goats was only on “loan” to keep Billy company and he was returned to his original home when Billy was taken in by Larry Gagnon who operates The Silver Tabby. The ducks, peacocks, and chickens have all been relocated to farms or large properties that are better equipped for these types of animals. Jack and Jerry are now living with one of our volunteers and Buddy is now also living temporarily with another Second Chance volunteer.

A great deal of work is needed to maintain the sanctuary buildings and grounds in good condition. A job list has been sent to all volunteers and is enclosed with this letter. The most important task on the list is a new roof for the house. Please call George (905-426-2922) if you are handy with a hammer, saw, rake, etc.

The Board of Directors and volunteers of Second Chance are attempting to keep the sanctuary running but the success of this is very dependant on donations and volunteers.

Do you know that 100% of every donation goes directly to the running of the sanctuary and to provide veterinary care and food for the animals! Speaking of veterinary care --- these costs are generally in the thousands of dollars each month. Other than two part-time employees (one to work in the house and one to work in the sanctuary), the sanctuary is completely volunteer-operated.

Unlike many charities, there is no large amount taken out for administration expenses.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The fact that Joyce is no longer at the sanctuary seems to have had no effect on the requests for help! The sanctuary continues to be busy with many calls regarding placement of “stray” cats, new mothers, numerous babies and **(the unthinkable)** cats that are being turned out by their owners due to allergy problems or cats who are left behind when their owners move **(how could one move and forget a member of their family?)**. The sanctuary continues to open the door to many of these animals though, with over 200 cats, there really isn't the room or financial means to handle these new residents.

Our previous newsletter mentioned about people just “dropping animals off” --- unfortunately, this practice is still continuing! It would make sense for people, who are inclined to “drop” an animal, to realize that the “dropped animal” may not be discovered immediately and risks becoming overheated in the summer months or freezing in the winter months. **Animals released loose on the sanctuary grounds will very likely be a meal**

for the coyotes before being trapped/found by the animal care workers or volunteers!

The most recent drop off of cats (“surrendered” according to an email received from their owners) is Telsa and Tommy who were found near Concession Road 7 and the laneway to Second Chance. Unfortunately, Telsa had to be euthanized as testing was not recommended for her as she was so thin that she looked like she had been an occupant of a concentration camp. Tommy has just had all his teeth removed (a very expensive procedure) and he is now recovering. Good news for Tommy is that a long-time donator of the sanctuary has adopted Tommy and good news for Second Chance is that this donator paid for Tommy’s dental work.

The message that constantly comes through is although many people treat their animal(s) as a family member; there are some who think their pet(s) are disposable and do not want to bear any expense for them -- not even to do the fundamental **spaying/neutering and needles!**

These points will help Second Chance to obtain many items needed for the Sanctuary such as paper towels, facial tissue, and pillows for the cages.

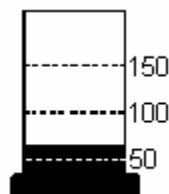
