SANCTUARY

It is now more than 6 months since the devastating news of Joyce's death. Many changes have taken place in the house — one room on the main floor, which has a separate heating system, is now home to all mothers and kittens as well as healthy "new arrivals". The rooms upstairs have been cleared out and one room is now home to some of our older cats — cats that would not do well in the sanctuary environment. Walls have been washed and painted, carpets have been removed from several rooms which means we are **now in need of linoleum or tiles for these floors.**

Please call (9095-426-2922) if you have or know of anyone who has linoleum or tiles that they do not need! Certain areas of the house have been screened off to permit the segregation of cats, specifically feral cats and cats with medical problems. The work continues!

Do you know that 100% of every donation goes directly to the running of the sanctuary and to provide veterinary care and food for the animals! Speaking of veterinary care --- these costs are generally in the thousands of dollars each month. Other than one employee for the house and one employee for the sanctuary, SCWS is completely volunteer-operated. Unlike many charities, there is no large amount taken out for administration expenses.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting, which was held on February 22nd, was well attended by the members of Second Chance Wildlife Sanctuary. The positions on the Board of

Directors were filled by acclamation, as follows:

Membership in Second Chance is new. You may not be a member even though you are a donor. Under the Second Chance by-law, donors are not automatically members. Membership dues are \$75.00 per person annually and you may access the membership application on our website. Primarily, membership in Second Chance will permit you to have more input on the operation of the sanctuary and, once a year at the annual general meeting, members are able to nominate and elect other members to the Board of Directors as well as approve the financial statements. Members and donors will find it beneficial to visit the website from time to time to ensure that you are aware of any and all activities.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Second Chance recently received two separate calls regarding cats left in apartments when the residents moved – 10 cats (including a mother and seven kittens in one apartment and five cats (including two kittens in the other apartment)! Unfortunately, one of the cats from the second apartment had been badly bitten and it was necessary for this cat to spend more than a week at the vet's in order to receive the necessary medication. In response to another call, a volunteer spent almost two weeks attempting to trap a stray cat – success finally arrived late one night, just before the recent cold spell (thank goodness). This cat, it turned out, was very pregnant and gave birth to two kittens within a week of trapping. A cat (who

was taking refuge in the back yard of one of our volunteers) was caught and brought to the vet. This cat had a very bad neck wound which the vet repaired – it was felt that the wound was old but was not healing as the cat had not been treated. One more reason why cats should not be allowed to run free!! The sanctuary continues to open the door to many of these animals though, with 200 cats, there really isn't the room or financial means to handle these new residents.

The following table, based on an unsprayed female cat and all of her offspring, producing two litters per year, with 2.8 surviving kittens per litter provides an idea of the dangerous result of not spaying or neutering your cat:

1 year -12 cats 2 years -67 cats 3 years -376 cats 4 years -2,107 cats 5 years -11,801 cats 6 years -66,088 cats 7 years -370,092 cats 8 years - 2,072,514 cats 9 years - 11,606,077 cats

Based on this information, it is **MOST** difficult to understand how some people believe that their cat should be allowed to produce at least **ONE** litter before spaying!

In case you are not aware, the SPCA is now operating a low-cost spay and neuter clinic in New Market. The spay or neuter fee is \$50 for cats and vaccines are \$10 each. Female dogs are \$80 and males are \$60. For more information, please visit the web site ontariospca.ca.


